

50th Anniversary Fall "Classic" Concert - October 24, 2025

The Clear Lake Symphony, with Conductor and Music Director, Robert F. Wall, starts its 50th season in the Fall of 2025. The Symphony, recognized as a premiere community orchestra, is a member of ASCAP and BMI. Its goals are to present classical music for the residents of the Bay Area and to provide opportunities for the Bay Area musicians to create a variety of musical experiences for the enjoyment of the community. Five regular season performances, which includes the Christmas "Pops," will be held featuring various classical selections and guest soloists.

All concerts will be held at Gloria Dei Lutheran Church Auditorium, 18220 Upper Bay Road in Nassau Bay across from NASA Johnson Space Center at 7:30 PM.



The Clear Lake Symphony will be performing the second concert of their 2025-2026 season on Friday, October 24, 2025 at 7:30 PM in the Gloria Dei Lutheran Church Worship Center located at 18220 Upper Bay Road across from NASA Johnson Space Center. Celebrating their 50th season, the Orchestra will present a delightful evening of light classical and popular music for their Fall "Classics" concert.


The Orchestra will be led by Robert Wall, Conductor of the Clear Lake Symphony.





Dr. Charles Johnson - Guest Conductor

Charles Anthony Johnson received his M.A. in composition and his Ph.D. in musicology from the University of California at Los Angeles. As a student he played violin and viola in the Stockton Symphony, University of Pacific and UCLA orchestras, and was Assistant Conductor of the UCLA Orchestra.

From 1967 until 1978, Dr. Johnson was on the faculty of Sam Houston State University in Huntsville, Texas, where he taught music history and theory and conducted the orchestra. While there, he also established and was a member of the faculty string quartet, and from 1974 to 1978 was conductor of the Bryan-College Station Chamber Orchestra.

Dr. Johnson was a violist with the Houston Ballet Orchestra from 1973 to 2013 and has also performed with such groups and artists as the American Ballet Theater, Joffrey Ballet, Ballet Nacionale de Cuba, Royal Ballet, Royal Canadian Ballet, Eva Marton, Jose Carerras, and others. Dr. Johnson was the Conductor and Music Director of the Houston Civic Symphony for 6 years, and Conductor and Music Director of the Clear Lake Symphony for 45 years until his retirement in 2024.



Dr. Andrew Staupe - Guest Pianist

Pianist Andrew Staupe is emerging as one of the distinctive voices of a new generation of pianists. Andrew has appeared as soloist with many of the top orchestras throughout the United States and in Europe, including the Baltimore Symphony, San Diago Symphony, Houston Symphony, Minnesota Orchestra, Fort Worth Symphony, Indianapolis Symphony, the George Enescu Philharmonic in Romania, and many others.

Andrew has performed recitals across the United States and extensively in Europe, appearing in distinguished concert venues including the Concertgebouw in Amsterdam, Rachmaninov Hall in Moscow, the Schumann Haus in Leipzig, and the Salle Cortot in Paris. Other notable performances include concerts at Carnegie Hall and Steinway Hall in New York, and the Kennedy Center and Library of Congress in Washington DC. He has been heard twice on American Public Media's "Performance Today," and on Garrison Keillor's "A Prairie Home Companion" in 2004.

Deeply committed to teaching, Andrew is an Assistant Professor of Piano at the University of Houston, and formerly taught at the University of Utah. He is Artistic Director of the young Artist World Piano Festival in Minnesota, and gives frequent master classes and lectures around the united States. A native of Saint Paul, Minnesota, he earned his Doctorate at Rice University with Jon Kimura Parker, and also studied at the University of Minnesota with Lydia Artymiw.

2025 - 2026 Season Youth Concerto Competition

The Clear Lake Symphony will hold the competition on January 17, 2026 for young artists from Houston area high schools, junior highs, and elementary schools. The winners are provided with a scholarship and the opportunity to perform with the Symphony. The winners will perform on the March 27th concert in 2026. Applications must be submitted on-line by December 13, 2025. Any applications submitted after this time will not be considered. We will not accept any mail-in applications.

The aim of the Competition is to enhance music performance and appreciation by:

- encouraging promising students to prepare high quality performance materials
- ♦ aiding instrumental and piano teachers in the Houston/Galveston Metro Area in so encouraging their students
- ♦ provide opportunities for the students to perform with the Clear Lake Symphony before a live audience

Scholarship awards will be granted to the winner of each category in each Division.

Competition Rules

Any student residing in the Houston/Galveston Metro area not over the age of 19 and not yet out of high school is eligible to enter the Competition. A student who wins the competition is ineligible to perform in the competition the following year. A former Concerto Competition winner must wait for one (1) year before re-entering.

Junior Division - Students not having reached the of age 15 by September 1, 2025.

Senior Division - Students having reached the age 15, but not having reached the age of 19 by September 1, 2025.

There are three separately judged instrumental categories in each division.

- 1) Winds & Percussion
- 2) Strings
- 3) Piano

Any movement of a large work for solo instrument and orchestra is acceptable, provided that an orchestration is readily available for the Symphony's use. All selections are subject to the approval of the Clear Lake Symphony Conductor. Memory is suggested but not required.

It is the contestant's responsibility to determine, before their application is submitted, whether or not an orchestration for their piece is available for the performance. If no orchestration is available, they should choose another piece with which to audition and perform.

Each contestant must arrange for piano accompaniment using piano reduction for the orchestration. Contestants should bring an original copy of the music for the judges to view during the competition. **The piece must be limited to no more than 12 minutes.** The Competition Coordinator has the authority to make binding decisions regarding conformity to competition regulations.
